# SCRIPTURE

## Revelation 1:1-20

<sup>1</sup>The revelation from Jesus Christ, which God gave him to show his servants what must soon take place. He made it known by sending his angel to his servant John, <sup>2</sup> who testifies to everything he saw—that is, the word of God and the testimony of Jesus Christ. <sup>3</sup>Blessed is the one who reads aloud the words of this prophecy, and blessed are those who hear it and take to heart what is written in it, because the time is near.

## <sup>4</sup> John,

To the seven churches in the province of Asia:

Grace and peace to you from him who is, and who was, and who is to come, and from the seven spirits before his throne, <sup>5</sup> and from Jesus Christ, who is the faithful witness, the firstborn from the dead, and the ruler of the kings of the earth.

To him who loves us and has freed us from our sins by his blood, <sup>6</sup> and has made us to be a kingdom and priests to serve his God and Father—to him be glory and power for ever and ever! Amen.

\* "Look, he is coming with the clouds," and "every eye will see him,
even those who pierced him"; and all peoples on earth "will mourn because of him."
So shall it be! Amen.

<sup>8</sup> "I am the Alpha and the Omega," says the Lord God, "who is, and who was, and who is to come, the Almighty." 91, John, your brother and companion in the suffering and kingdom and patient endurance that are ours in Jesus, was on the island of Patmos because of the word of God and the testimony of Jesus. <sup>10</sup>On the Lord's Day I was in the Spirit, and I heard behind me a loud voice like a trumpet, <sup>11</sup> which said: "Write on a scroll what you see and send it to the seven churches: to Ephesus, Smyrna, Pergamum, Thyatira, Sardis, Philadelphia and Laodicea."

<sup>12</sup> I turned around to see the voice that was speaking to me. And when I turned I saw seven golden lampstands, <sup>13</sup> and among the lampstands was someone like a son of man, dressed in a robe reaching down to his feet and with a golden sash around his chest. <sup>14</sup> The hair on his head was white like wool, as white as snow, and his eyes were like blazing fire. <sup>15</sup> His feet were like bronze glowing in a furnace, and his voice was like the sound of rushing waters. <sup>16</sup> In his right hand he held seven stars, and coming out of his mouth was a sharp, double-edged sword. His face was like the sun shining in all its brilliance.

# **Fulfilling Our Unique Calling**

As we make our new year resolutions, consider how we can best invest our time and resources; consider what is the main task God has assigned to us and how we can be faithful to this task.

Advent reminds us how God used a star to lead wise men from the east over hundreds of miles to seek Christ. Yet, King Herod and all of Jerusalem were troubled by this news (Matt 2:1-3). Through Christ's birth, perhaps they sensed that the days of their institutional religion were numbered. How could they who studied the Scripture all their lives missed the One all Scripture anticipated?

Our core problem is seen in Herod and the Jewish leaders. They cared about their power, influence, and leadership position so much that they would remove any competition or challenge to their positions, including Jesus, the long-awaited Saviour. Does this not remind us of similar stories in countries ruled by dictators who ban churches and oppress their people? Sadly, this is the same underlying ambition and need for self-preservation that drive the office politics plaguing many workplaces today.

When we place success, power, status, influence, approval, control, security, comfort, and the good life above God, we have replaced God with something far less than Him, even if they are noble things. We have sinned and fallen short of God's glory as Rom 3:23 says. We have fallen short of what God has created us for, to enjoy Him and to reflect His image and glory.

The Jewish leaders' awareness and yet indifference to the Saviour born among them shows we need more than Scriptural knowledge, and more than the coming of Christ to be saved. We need a heart change. We need to be born again. We need the Holy Spirit to remake our hearts and to draw us to Christ. Otherwise, the preaching of the Gospel will fall on deaf ears. We will remain blind to our sins and our need for the Saviour. This is Scripture's diagnosis of our human condition.

If the sin that so blinds us is our greatest problem, the answer to it must lie in the urgent God-given task of the church to preach the Gospel. However, the faithful preaching of the Gospel alone is not enough. We need to pray, for the Holy Spirit must work in the hearts of the hearers. So, as we plan for the year ahead, how we may give ourselves over to ever more faithfully praying and proclaiming the Gospel?

#### **Read Revelation 4**

- In Revelation 4, who was the person being worshipped?
- Why was he being worshipped?
- How will you respond to this person given who he is and what he has done?

#### **Prayer Points**

- Pray that all our members will spend time reflecting on how he or she can serve God out of love for Him.
- Pray for those serving in the Finance committee. As they serve with faith, may God care for them and their families in every area of their lives.
- Pray for the Government as they prepare to derive a progressive, sound and caring budget to be delivered on 18 February this year. Please care for all those involved in the process that God will sustain them as they toil for Singapore.

## Latest updates on ORPC Alteration & Additions (A&A) Project December 2024

Building a Disciple Making Church Our Legacy of Faith for Future Generations

#### 1. Confirmation of Off-site Worship and Office Locations

After site visits to various locations around Singapore, the A&A logistics team has confirmed **Suntec Convention Centre** as our off-site venue for worship services during the rebuilding works. Here are more details of the actual locations:

Worship: Suntec Convention Centre, Main Hall, Rooms 308-311 Children's Ministry: Rooms 300, 301, 302

The church office will be located separately from the worship venue, at YWCA Outram, together with Gereja Presbyterian Orchard (GPO), our Indonesian congregation, as well as PPC admin/pastoral offices.

Both arrangements are firm, and are pending finalisation of contracts.

#### 2. A&A Move-out Dates

We will be officially moving out of the church building **2nd week of October 2025**, to avoid the F1 activities in the week prior. Here are some other key milestones which we would like you to be prepared for:

In **June 2025**, our pastoral and admin staff will be making the move to YWCA ahead of the congregation's shift to Suntec Convention Centre in October 2025.

From **July 2025**, the office at YWCA Outram will be fully operational. We will also commence pre-move familiarisation activities including adopting the new off-site worship format which will be fully-electronic. (More details on this are provided in the next section). Discipleship group and fellowship meetings will also be moved offsite with meetings in homes highly encouraged. Music ministry sessions i.e. Choir practice, will be held at YWCA.

#### 3. Key Adjustments in 2025

As we undertake this big move as a united family, we hope that congregation members can continue to support each other through the transition as there will be big changes ahead of us before the actual move, to get everyone ready for the new venue and worship format.



#### Children's Ministry

- Starting **January 2025**, the Children's Ministry will be re-structured to a 3 room format, providing a longer transition time for our children, and to allow for fine tuning before the actual move
- Safety measures for the children in Suntec are currently being planned and will be introduced gradually
- More details will be given to parents on **29 December 2024** at the Family Worship session

#### Worship

- At the new venue, Sunday Worship will be fully electronic with no hard copy bulletins and fully electronic giving of tithes and offerings, to minimise logistical and administrative efforts given the separate worship and office off-site venues
- The service will take place in one big hall, with no cry rooms provided for young babies and families. We hope that through this new arrangement, we create greater awareness and understanding toward families with young infants, and learn to worship together in one space
- During our time at the off-site venue, there will be black out Sundays due to large scale events that will involve the whole of Suntec Convention Centre this means we will not hold physical services and do livestream sessions instead

#### Communications

- We will be refreshing our church website and launching a church management portal in 2025 so that congregation members have a central place for information as we go through this transition
- We will be activating some official communication channels to keep everyone engaged on the move, and will be updating you soon
- Starting **first half of 2025**, we will be creating engagement forums for the people to interact, receive information and provide feedback throughout the process of the A&A

#### Moving Out as One Church

- We are 3 congregations and 2 churches, and have been operating autonomously. Moving forward, we need to learn to operate as 1 church before we move out. May this be an opportunity for us to know one another across congregations and churches, and be more united as a result.

#### What is a pledge?

# HISTORY

The Orchard Road Presbyterian Church (ORPC) was founded in 1856 to minister to the needs of the Scots community in Singapore. The first church building on the present site was completed in 1878, and has been extended several times. In 1975, the sanctuary was extended, and in 1985, the new extension of Dunman Hall was completed and a new chapel was built. Alongside the growth of the physical facilities has been the development of the church from an Englishspeaking expatriate congregation to a local church embracing four different language congregations. In 1995 we planted a branch church (Bukit Batok Presbyterian Church) which became independent in 2013. Similarly, our Mandarin congregation (Providence Presbyterian Church) became independent in 2005. ORPC consists of the English Congregation and the Indonesian Congregation, and worshipping with us now in the same building are Providence Presbyterian Church, and the German-speaking Protestant Congregation in Singapore.

# FAITH AND MEMBERSHIP

As a church with roots in historic Presbyterianism growing out of the Westminster Confession of Faith, we affirm the Lordship of our Saviour, Jesus Christ. We look to the Scriptures as the inspired Word of God and the one authoritative and infallible standard for our faith and practice. We welcome those who profess Jesus Christ as their personal Lord and Saviour into our formal membership. Our membership is truly international, representing the breadth of God's call upon people from all ethnic and economic backgrounds. Members are received upon initial profession of faith in Jesus Christ by baptism, confirmation, and in transfer from other Christian churches. Classes for baptism, confirmation, and for transfer of membership are held periodically and announced in the bulletin.

# THE APOSTLES' CREED

I believe in God, the Father almighty, Creator of heaven and earth. I believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord. He was conceived by the power of the Holy Spirit and born of the Virgin Mary.
