SCRIPTURE

1 John 3:11-24

¹¹ For this is the message you heard from the beginning: We should love one another. ¹² Do not be like Cain, who belonged to the evil one and murdered his brother. And why did he murder him? Because his own actions were evil and his brother's were righteous. ¹³ Do not be surprised, my brothers and sisters, if the world hates you. ¹⁴ We know that we have passed from death to life, because we love each other. Anyone who does not love remains in death. ¹⁵ Anyone who hates a brother or sister is a murderer, and you know that no murderer has eternal life residing in him.

¹⁶ This is how we know what love is: Jesus Christ laid down his life for us. And we ought to lay down our lives for our brothers and sisters. ¹⁷ If anyone has material possessions and sees a brother or sister in need but has no pity on them, how can the love of God be in that person? ¹⁸ Dear children, let us not love with words or speech but with actions and in truth.

¹⁹ This is how we know that we belong to the truth and how we set our hearts at rest in his presence: ²⁰ If our hearts condemn us, we know that God is greater than our hearts, and he knows everything. ²¹ Dear friends, if our hearts do not condemn us, we have confidence before God ²² and receive from him anything we ask, because we keep his commands and do what pleases him. ²³ And this is his command: to believe in the name of his Son, Jesus Christ, and to love one another as he commanded us. ²⁴ The one who keeps God's commands lives in him, and he in them. And this is how we know that he lives in us: We know it by the Spirit he gave us.

Certainty in Change

Recently I was passing through Tiong Bahru and it occurred to me that soon, despite conservation measures in the area, the area would change and look different once more as it had many times in the last 30 years or so. And that made me a little bit sad. It's not that change is the enemy, much of the change that I see around me has been for good reasons and has good results. It's that change makes me – us – feel adrift. With no physical anchors to show that our past did happen here, no familiar landmarks to mentally reenact memories against, the past feels unreal, and sometimes even inconsequential. And even more so as time passes and it feels like no one else shares these memories with you. It doesn't matter how much I try to describe the terrapin pond and the dark corridors of Tiong Bahru Market, if you weren't there, it's hard for you to understand.

And now we are preparing for A&A. To be honest, I'm not sure that I myself am mentally prepared to come through Dhoby Ghaut and see a different ORPC, even though the Sanctuary remains. All my memories of the last 22 years in ORPC are of the buildings in the present form, current steps to Dunman Hall and the umbrellas excepted. Moving away is going to be really hard for me emotionally, I think, even though I'm up to my neck in the preparations for all of these changes. And returning when the construction work is done is going to be bittersweet. The work is needed, the changes are for the better, but we are still allowed to be sad about it.

But also I am thankful. Lots of things are going to change for us in the next 2-3 years in terms of our locations, building, and even how we do worship to some extent. But despite all the changes I am thankful because I know that this church is not only about where we worship, what our building is like, or even how our worship is like. I am thankful because at our heart, ORPC is about making disciples, about a common goal to know God and to make Him known. ORPC is about God's people coming together to worship God and to do His will. Our people's love for God will not change even as we go through all these changes together, and more importantly, God will not change. We have certainty in change; we can embrace the change because of this – because our God is an unchanging God, a faithful God who will be with us through all these changes, who will use the changes for His glory. Hallelujah!

Prayer Points

- Pray for Formwerkz Multi-Disciplinary Team ask God to smoothen the path ahead as they make submissions to the authorities.
- Pray for those who have parents and/or grandparents who do not yet know Christ. Pray for them to have a personal encounter with God and for them to come to Christ.
- Pray that God will raise up more leaders after His own heart, both for our church community and to be lights in their professional spheres.

Latest updates on ORPC Alteration & Additions (A&A) Project

February 2025

Building a Disciple Making Church Our Legacy of Faith for Future Generations

1. Changes to Worship Service

Though we move out only in October, we have begun making changes to how we do Sunday worship. This is so that we don't get surprised when we move out and we get a chance to try and refine our changes before we go to Suntec.

Children's Ministry

The first major change is in the Children's Ministry. From 5 January 2025, the children have started on a re-structured format for Sunday School. Both the children and teachers are taking some time to get used to this new format before introducing further changes.



Information Dissemination

Our weekly bulletin & announcements are being sent out through the WhatsApp broadcast. This will help us when we move to soft copy bulletins in July.

Upcoming Changes

In May, we will be updating our bulletin format to support soft copy dissemination. Our website format will also be updated for easier reading.

In July, we will be moving to electronic transfers only for our offerings and soft copy bulletins.

2. Off-site Locations

The contract with YWCA Outram (where our pastoral and administrative offices will be located) has been signed. Basic renovations are beginning in preparation for our offices to move in June.



3. Sunday Services in Suntec

Our morning and evening services will continue while we are in Suntec. Set up begins at about 7AM and teardown ends at about 7.30PM each Sunday.

4. Fundraising Recap and Updates

The fund-raising target for ORPC is **\$23 million**. Fundraising efforts will be focused on raising \$10 million, with the remainder of \$13 million being funded by our existing reserves. Raising more than \$10 million will help us to offset potential unexpected expenses and reduce the draw-down effect on our reserves.

HISTORY

The Orchard Road Presbyterian Church (ORPC) was founded in 1856 to minister to the needs of the Scots community in Singapore. The first church building on the present site was completed in 1878, and has been extended several times. In 1975, the sanctuary was extended, and in 1985, the new extension of Dunman Hall was completed and a new chapel was built. Alongside the growth of the physical facilities has been the development of the church from an Englishspeaking expatriate congregation to a local church embracing four different language congregations. In 1995 we planted a branch church (Bukit Batok Presbyterian Church) which became independent in 2013. Similarly, our Mandarin congregation (Providence Presbyterian Church) became independent in 2005. ORPC consists of the English Congregation and the Indonesian Congregation, and worshipping with us now in the same building are Providence Presbyterian Church, and the German-speaking Protestant Congregation in Singapore.

FAITH AND MEMBERSHIP

As a church with roots in historic Presbyterianism growing out of the Westminster Confession of Faith, we affirm the Lordship of our Saviour, Jesus Christ. We look to the Scriptures as the inspired Word of God and the one authoritative and infallible standard for our faith and practice. We welcome those who profess Jesus Christ as their personal Lord and Saviour into our formal membership. Our membership is truly international, representing the breadth of God's call upon people from all ethnic and economic backgrounds. Members are received upon initial profession of faith in Jesus Christ by baptism, confirmation, and in transfer from other Christian churches. Classes for baptism, confirmation, and for transfer of membership are held periodically and announced in the bulletin.

THE APOSTLES' CREED

I believe in God, the Father almighty, Creator of heaven and earth. I believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord. He was conceived by the power of the Holy Spirit and born of the Virgin Mary. He suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried. He descended to the grave. On the third day he rose again. He ascended into heaven, and is seated at the right hand of God the Father almighty. He will come again to judge the living and the dead.
