SCRIPTURE

John 20:1-29

¹ Early on the first day of the week, while it was still dark, Mary Magdalene went to the tomb and saw that the stone had been removed from the entrance. ² So she came running to Simon Peter and the other disciple, the one Jesus loved, and said, "They have taken the Lord out of the tomb, and we don't know where they have put him!"

³ So Peter and the other disciple started for the tomb. ⁴ Both were running, but the other disciple outran Peter and reached the tomb first. ⁵ He bent over and looked in at the strips of linen lying there but did not go in. ⁶ Then Simon Peter came along behind him and went straight into the tomb. He saw the strips of linen lying there, ⁷ as well as the cloth that had been wrapped around Jesus' head. The cloth was still lying in its place, separate from the linen. ⁸ Finally the other disciple, who had reached the tomb first, also went inside. He saw and believed. ⁹ (They still did not understand from Scripture that Jesus had to rise from the dead.) ¹⁰ Then the disciples went back to where they were staying.

¹¹ Now Mary stood outside the tomb crying. As she wept, she bent over to look into the tomb ¹² and saw two angels in white, seated where Jesus' body had been, one at the head and the other at the foot.

13 They asked her, "Woman, why are you crying?"

"They have taken my Lord away," she said, "and I don't know where they have put him." 14 At this, she turned around and saw Jesus standing there, but she did not realize that it was Jesus.

¹⁵ He asked her, "Woman, why are you crying? Who is it you are looking for?" Thinking he was the gardener, she said, "Sir, if you have carried him away, tell me where you have put him, and I will get him."

16 Jesus said to her, "Mary."

She turned toward him and cried out in Aramaic, "Rabboni!" (which means "Teacher").

- ¹⁷ Jesus said, "Do not hold on to me, for I have not yet ascended to the Father. Go instead to my brothers and tell them, 'I am ascending to my Father and your Father, to my God and your God.'"
- ¹⁸ Mary Magdalene went to the disciples with the news: "I have seen the Lord!" And she told them that he had said these things to her.
- ¹⁹ On the evening of that first day of the week, when the disciples were together, with the doors locked for fear of the Jewish leaders, Jesus came and stood among them and said, "Peace be with you!" ²⁰ After he said this, he showed them his hands and side. The disciples were overjoyed when they saw the Lord.
- ²¹ Again Jesus said, "Peace be with you! As the Father has sent me, I am sending you." ²² And with that he breathed on them and said, "Receive the Holy Spirit. ²³ If you forgive anyone's sins, their sins are forgiven; if you do not forgive them, they are not forgiven."
- ²⁴ Now Thomas (also known as Didymus), one of the Twelve, was not with the disciples when Jesus came. ²⁵ So the other disciples told him, "We have seen the Lord!"

But he said to them, "Unless I see the nail marks in his hands and put my finger where the nails were, and put my hand into his side, I will not believe."

- ²⁶ A week later his disciples were in the house again, and Thomas was with them. Though the doors were locked, Jesus came and stood among them and said, "Peace be with you!" ²⁷ Then he said to Thomas, "Put your finger here; see my hands. Reach out your hand and put it into my side. Stop doubting and believe."
- ²⁸ Thomas said to him, "My Lord and my God!"
- ²⁹ Then Jesus told him, "Because you have seen me, you have believed; blessed are those who have not seen and yet have believed."

Sharing in David's Blessing through Christ's Resurrection

Paul tells us in Acts 13:33 that God has brought us the good news He promised to the fathers, "This he has fulfilled to us their children by raising Jesus, as it is written in the second Psalm, 'You are my Son, today I have begotten you.'" The resurrection didn't change Jesus' status and identity. It's God's public declaration of who Jesus is from all eternity.

And Jesus' resurrection carries tremendous significance for us. Paul moved on to say in v.34, "He raised him from the dead, no more to return to corruption, he has spoken in this way, 'I will give you the holy and sure blessings of David.'"

What are the holy blessings of David? Paul explained earlier in Acts 13:22-23 that after God had removed King Saul, He raised David and said, "I have found in David the son of Jesse, a man after my heart, who will do all my will." From David's offspring, God gave us Jesus, our Saviour. Since death stood in the way of His everlasting kingdom, God raised Jesus from the dead, never to see death and corruption again. In the same way, Romans 6:8 says, "Now if we died with Christ, we believe that we will also live with him."

Jesus is the perfectly righteous King who has replaced our gloom and defeat by transferring us into the kingdom of His light. We now share in the blessings of David as we share in Christ's resurrection and His defeat of death. We were buried with Him in baptism and raised with Him to a new life. This life begins with a new identity and a new way of living. This means two things.

First, we have been buried with Christ and are dead to sin. Second, we are resurrected with Him and are now alive to God. This means choosing God over sin. This means no longer offering the members of our body to sin as instruments of wickedness, but to God as weapons of righteousness. This means using our abilities, words, imaginations, reasons, strength, and desires for God's glory. We have been forever united with Christ in His resurrection. So, like Jesus, the true David, we are now men and women after God's heart. We share in Christ this new life now and in eternity. Let us rejoice and celebrate this new resurrection life, to live it out by seeking to do His will all our days.

Read Hebrews 1:5-14

- What is so unique in the relationship between Jesus and God, particularly in contrast to the angels? And what does it reveal about Jesus' divine sonship?
- In Hebrews 1:8-9, the author refers to the Son's eternal throne and righteousness. How do these verses emphasize the contrast between the Son's reign and that of the angels?
- What does Hebrews 1:10-12 reveal about the eternal and unchanging nature of Jesus in comparison to creation, and how does this show His superiority over all things?

Prayer Points

- Pray for the church congregations as we prepare to move off-site for our worship services and ministries.
- Pray for Singapore's upcoming general election, that the process will be fair and voters wise and discerning in casting their votes.
- Pray for wisdom in response for world leaders leading their countries in today's uncertain geo-political and economic landscape.

Extraordinary Congregational Meeting (ECM) on Sunday, 25 May 2025, for Amendments to the ORPC Constitution

I am writing to urge you to attend our Extraordinary Congregational Meeting (ECM) on Sunday, 25 May 2025 immediately following the AM and PM services.

In that meeting, we will ask you to consider and pass the following resolutions to amend our church constitution.

- 1. To state the biblical teaching on marriage as limited to a union between a man and a woman.
- 2. To clarify that "the Elders and Deacons Court" also be recognised as the "Board of Management."
- 3. To remove the term "serving" Elders and/or Deacons to represent ORPC to the general meetings of the relevant Presbytery and the Synod.
- 4. To allow for hybrid or virtual meetings so as to avoid physical or inperson meetings in case of the imposition of national health measures.

Your participation is critical because we require a quorum of 50% of the total membership in order to amend the church constitution. Please mark your calendar and plan to join the meeting. May the Lord also grant you wisdom to consider these important amendments to the church constitution.

PRESBYTERIAN PRIMARY SCHOOLS — P1 PHASE 2B REGISTRATION

ORPC members who wish to register their children in Kuo Chuan Presbyterian Primary School (Bishan) or Pei Hwa Presbyterian Primary School (Bukit Timah) at Phase 2B for admission to Primary One in January 2026 are to request for the Letter of Eligibility ("Form B"), before Monday, 5 May 2025, from the church office via email to orpcenglish@orpc.org.sg stating (a) full names of both parents of the child, (b) at least one contact number, (c) which ministry in ORPC that parent(s) is/are serving and (d) from when the parent(s) has/have been serving.

The eligibility for *priority* in P1 registration under Phase 2B is guided by the following conditions:

- 1. Child is either a Singapore Citizen or a Singapore Permanent Resident.
- At least one parent being an active communicant member of ORPC. An 'active communicant member' here refers to a baptised church member who has volunteered at least one year of service to ORPC i.e. has been serving on or before 1 June 2024.
- 3. If the number of applicants exceed the number of vacancies in the school, places will be balloted according to the following order of priority:
 - a) Singapore Citizens will be given priority over Singapore Permanent Residents, before home-school distance is considered.
 - b) Children living within 1km of the school.
 - c) Children living between 1km and 2km of the school.
 - d) Children living outside 2km of the school.

 Applicants may check the home-school distance via this link: https://www.onemap.gov.sg/#/SchoolQueryInfo
- Parents are to submit hardcopies of the following to the church office, latest, by Monday, 5 May 2025:
 - i. 'Letter of Eligibility' ("Form B") with Section A completed;
 - ii. Photocopy of Child's birth certificate/Citizenship certificate/PR document;
 - iii. Photocopy of both parents' NRIC
 - iv. Photocopy of Child's immunisation certificate.
- The Letter of Eligibility issued by the Church gives the applicant priority in registration in an earlier Phase, namely Phase 2B, but does not guarantee a place in the school.

- Important: Parents will still need to complete an online registration (MOE's) under Phase 2B national registration exercise in July 2025. Do watch out for MOE's registration dates and the documents that would be required.

HISTORY

The Orchard Road Presbyterian Church (ORPC) was founded in 1856 to minister to the needs of the Scots community in Singapore. The first church building on the present site was completed in 1878, and has been extended several times. In 1975, the sanctuary was extended, and in 1985, the new extension of Dunman Hall was completed and a new chapel was built. Alongside the growth of the physical facilities has been the development of the church from an English-speaking expatriate congregation to a local church embracing four different language congregations. In 1995 we planted a branch church (Bukit Batok Presbyterian Church) which became independent in 2013. Similarly, our Mandarin congregation (Providence Presbyterian Church) became independent in 2005. ORPC consists of the English Congregation and the Indonesian Congregation, and worshipping with us now in the same building are Providence Presbyterian Church, and the German-speaking Protestant Congregation in Singapore.

FAITH AND MEMBERSHIP

As a church with roots in historic Presbyterianism growing out of the Westminster Confession of Faith, we affirm the Lordship of our Saviour, Jesus Christ. We look to the Scriptures as the inspired Word of God and the one authoritative and infallible standard for our faith and practice. We welcome those who profess Jesus Christ as their personal Lord and Saviour into our formal membership. Our membership is truly international, representing the breadth of God's call upon people from all ethnic and economic backgrounds. Members are received upon initial profession of faith in Jesus Christ by baptism, confirmation, and in transfer from other Christian churches. Classes for baptism, confirmation, and for transfer of membership are held periodically and announced in the bulletin.

THE APOSTLES' CREED

I believe in God, the Father almighty, Creator of heaven and earth. I believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord. He was conceived by the power of the Holy Spirit and born of the Virgin Mary.
